### **Biography**

Richard Moon is a Professor in the Faculty of Law, University of Windsor. He holds degrees from Trent, Queen's, and Oxford universities. He was called to the Ontario Bar in 1984. He is the author of *The Constitutional Protection of Freedom of Expression* (University of Toronto Press, 2000), *Freedom of Conscience and Religion* (Irwin Law, forthcoming 2014) editor of *Law and Religious Pluralism in Canada* (UBC Press, 2008) and a contributing editor to *Canadian Constitutional Law* (3<sup>rd</sup> and 4th ed.) (Emond Montgomery Press, 2007 and 2010). In 2008 he wrote a report for the Canadian Human Rights Commission dealing with the legal regulation of hate speech on the Internet. In 2009 he was awarded the University of Windsor Alumni Teaching Award. In 2013 he was the recipient of the Mary-Lou Dietz Equity Award for contributions to the advancement of equity in the university and in the larger community.

### **Research Statement**

Richard Moon's research focuses on freedom of religion and freedom of expression. He is in the process of completing a book manuscript: **Putting Faith in Hate: Religion as the Source and Subject of Hate Speech** – which considers the intersection between religion and hate speech regulation.
