Bio and Research Statement

Sara Ludin is a Ph.D. candidate in Jurisprudence and Social Policy at UC Berkeley. She works on law and religion, currently focusing on the early modern German lands. Her dissertation, for which she will be completing archival research in September 2015, explores the Reformation at the level of dispute resolution in courts, as courts provided one setting in which various parties were called upon, in the course of settling mundane disputes, to articulate what counted as a “matter of religion.” Before coming to Berkeley, Sara spent one year on a Fulbright in Berlin and a second year undertaking coursework towards an MA in Socio-Cultural Studies at Europa Universität Viadrina in Frankfurt an der Oder. She earned her BA in Philosophy from Dartmouth College. She is currently a visiting research fellow in the History Department at Brown University.
